

# Cop confusion at Village People-themed Hamptons bash

There was some hapless [Hamptons](#) confusion when a uniformed cop showed up to a party over the weekend in Water Mill, where 500-plus guests were required to dress like members of disco act [Village People](#) — including at least 100 in police-officer costumes.

“Sir” Ivan Wilzig hosted his annual over-the-top summer bash at his castle-like home, but

security was stumped when a real cop arrived to demand the music be turned down.

Village People cowboy Randy Jones told us, “There were Native Americans, soldiers, bikers, cops, sailors.” But when the real cop showed up after a neighbor’s noise complaint, party security thought he was just a crasher in costume.

“At 11:15 p.m. a policeman arrived by himself and made his way into the main gate, where almost no one was allowed,” said a spy. “They stopped him because he didn’t have the right wristband. Then they noticed he had ‘Code Enforcement’ on the back of his jacket.” The cop asked that music by DJ Sin Morera be turned down.

More (real) police came by 45 minutes later, and the party was moved inside to a Studio 54-themed disco.

Guests included Michael Musto and financier Marc Leder, who showed up with 10 female guests. The usually wild affair ended at a staid 1 a.m.
